Just a mile outside the city centre in Worcester is the biggest fish pass of its kind in England and Wales.


Step onto a manmade island in the middle of the river!

Arrive at Diglis Island for a 10.00am start

- Learn about the River Severn, its fish, the weirs and what we are doing to help.
- Do a hands-on STEM activity, using engineering principles to design a model to help the fish.
- Take a guided walk on the river path to find out about Britain's longest river.
- Visit the fish pass see this huge structure and think about the engineering involved in building it.
- Look through our underwater window into the river.
